Connectivity has become a key strategic concept in the international community. Japan has advocated "Free and Open Indo-Pacific (FOIP)" since 2016. The EU adopted "Strategy for Connecting Europe and Asia" in September 2018. Other actors have also promoted their own initiatives, "Eurasian Economic Union" of Russia and "One Belt, One Road" of China, among others. Former Minister of International Relations (1991-2) and Foreign Policy Advisor to the first President of the Slovak Republic Michal Kováč (1993-1997). He is freelance foreign policy analyst, author and anchor.

She graduated from Keio University, obtained M.A. in Law from the graduate school of University of Tokyo and obtained Ph.D in Media and Governance at Keio University (2006). She was Research Fellow of the UNU at UNDP, Azerbaijan.

Her research interests include International Politics, Comparative Politics, Peace and Conflict Study, Regional Study on the Former USSR.

He entered Ministry of Foreign Affairs in 1994 and started his career in Middle East and Africa Department. He has been assigned in Abu Dhabi (UAE), Nairobi (Kenya), Copenhagen (Denmark), Berlin (Germany) and Brussel (as Deputy Permanent Representative of the SR). He also held positions including Officer of Eastern European and Balkan countries Department, Deputy European Correspondent of the CFSP Department and DG for Economic Cooperation and ODA.

He entered Ministry of Transport of the Slovak Republic (2005). He also worked at International Organization for Migration in Bratislava (2008) and was Financial Manager of International Visegrad Fund in Bratislava (2008).

He has been in the current position since 2011.

He graduated from Taras Shevchenko University in Kiev (1989) and was awarded CSc by the Slovak Academy of Sciences (1998), and received his doctor habilitatus from Comenius University in Bratislava (2009).

He has been with the SFPA since 1995 and its Director of the Research Centre and Head of the Eastern Europe Research Program since 2000.

Ambassador Shimmi entered the Ministry of Foreign Affairs (MOFA) in 1983 and assigned posts overseas in France, Belgium (EU), Thailand, NY (UN), Washington DC (as Minister), and Djibouti (as Ambassador). He also held positions in Tokyo including Executive secretary to the Chief Cabinet Secretariat at the Prime Minister's Office, Director for EU, Director for National Security Policy, Deputy DG for Asia, Deputy DG for Policy Planning, and DG for Cultural Cooperation at MOFA.
